

RE: SNHPC Information and Activities

SNHPC has a number of activities your community may be interested in. Details can be found on our website, www.snhpc.org. We write to bring to your attention the following.

- **Finalization of 2021-2030 Ten-Year Transportation Improvement Plan Priorities:** At the April 2019 MPO meeting, Nate Miller explained SNHPC is focused on supplementing three existing Ten-Year Plan projects to ensure they are appropriately funded and completed on schedule. These projects are: NH 114 Corridor Study in Bedford/Goffstown; Intersection improvements at the intersection of NH 28/Roulston Rd; and U.S. 3 Widening in Bedford. An additional recommended priority is a bridge in Frankestown. The MPO voted to accept the TAC priority recommendations.
- **Pop-Up Planning in Southern NH:** Also during the April MPO meeting, Monique Duchesne and James Vayo gave an overview of Pop-Up Planning possibilities such as curb extensions, sidewalks, and parklets. They also reviewed the application process for borrowing equipment from SNHPC to aid in Pop-Up Planning.
- **Londonderry Update:** At the April 2019 SNHPC meeting, Colleen Mailloux, Town Planner for Londonderry, provided an overview of the recent development activity, including Woodmont Commons, Pettengill Road Commerce Park, and other projects.

The SNHPC region includes the City of Manchester and the towns of Auburn, Bedford, Candia, Chester, Deerfield, Derry, Frankestown, Goffstown, Hooksett, Londonderry, New Boston, Weare and Windham. The region encompasses portions of Hillsborough, Merrimack and Rockingham counties. Executive Order Number Fifteen, issued by former Governor Walter Peterson, delineated the SNHPC region. SNHPC promotes coordination between planning boards and local officials; intergovernmental cooperation; and coordinated development of the region.
