The Southern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission (SNHPC) will hold a public informational meeting on its U.S. EPA brownfields grant on Tuesday, March 29, 2016 from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. at the Manchester Department of Health, located at 1528 Elm Street, Manchester.

Brownfields are abandoned, idled, or underutilized properties where expansion, redevelopment, or reuse are complicated by real or perceived environmental contamination. The SNHPC has received a grant from the U.S. EPA to assist in assessment of the level of contamination on these properties – a key step in the process of reuse or redevelopment. NHDES and CRDC also have funding available to support Brownfields redevelopment projects.
